#### A SOCCER MOM'S LETTER

My son, David Hooks, began playing for Inner City Soccer Club when he was almost 5 years old. He enjoyed soccer before joining the club and, I noticed that he develops into a stronger player every year. The Inner City coaching staff

evaluates the players' skill sets each year and they work on strengthening David in areas where he is weak while

maximizing his strengths. They also host special training camps and invite collegiate and professional soccer players to do presentations and special skills sessions.

Despite his love of the game, as David became older, he noticed that many of his peers were not interested in soccer. In fact almost all of them either played basketball or football. At age 8, David asked if he could keep

playing soccer but also try another sport in the fall. I allowed him to play flag football and then basketball in the spring before soccer. As he executed the football or basketball practice drills or games, I

noticed many of the techniques and skills he had learned in soccer on the football fields and basketball courts, however, I have yet to see the skills he learned from football or basketball on the soccer field.

As a parent, I was very comfortable allowing him to play the game at 4.5 years old. He has the opportunity to continue



with this club until he is in his early teens. It is a great sport and I believe he may have developed a lifelong love of it.

#### <u>Copley High School Student Leads Action to Help Injured AICSC</u> Player

eth Moore, a student at Copley High School, is a goalie on both the Internationals Soccer Club and Copley Varsity Women Soccer teams. Beth suffered an injury to one of her kidneys when she was kneed during a game. Her kidney was nearly split in half as a result. Recovering well, Beth has been participating in practices and games since her injury.

In early October 2011, during the playoff season, a similar accident occurred to a player on the U14-boys from Akron Inner City Soccer Club. The player, Boo Le, was kneed in his face and suffered a shattered cheekbone that required surgery. Beth, informed by her mom Mrs. Joan Moore about this incident, was moved to take action.

Beth asked her mom if it was possible for her to help Boo Le and his family. Boo Le, who attends Jennings Middle School, and his family are refugees from Burma. Beth began by calling on all her friends and schoolmates to make a donation to Boo Le. Beth's brother, Doug Moore, who plays for Liberty U13 Boys, also called on his friends and schoolmates to do the same. Together, they raised \$256 and a \$20 gift certificate to Giant Eagle for

Boo Le and his family.

It is acts of kindness such as these that keep us connected as the human race. AISC would like to express heart felt thanks to the Moore family and friends for their Good Samaritan spirits and for reaching a child in need.
