NOTES FROM THE PRESIDENT



2013 was another successful year for our Year Round Youth Development/After School Soccer program. Our continued increase in players is a direct correlation of how the program is reaching, touching, and making positive life changes for the youth of Akron.

We began the year with 6 weeks of indoor footskills training to improve our players' technique in the off season. Average attendance for each session was 70 youth from the community. These free sessions were held at the Elder Johnson Family Center located on the campus of The House of the Lord. We then followed with 12 weeks of spring practices and league games, where we developed 12 teams with a total of 168 boys and girls. Following that was 5 weeks of free summer soccer camps, at five different locations throughout the city. These summer camps reached 500 community children. We ended the season with another 12 weeks of fall practices and league games, where we fielded 11 teams and served 140 boys and girls.

Last year our program provided 863 Akron inner city boys and girls ages 5-18 years old with adult supervised, enjoyable activities. Akron Inner City Soccer club continues to strive in making the program available and affordable to the parents. We work tirelessly to provide an avenue where Akron's inner city children learn positive, life enhancing lessons. All of this could not have been possible without the blessings of Almighty God, Akron area foundations, organizations, individuals, and anonymous donors. AICSC Bafana top nationally ranked team

The B4C1 is the oldest and the most skilled level in the fall division for the league. After a strong season and working to defeat nationally ranked teams such as The Internationals Soccer Club, our boys team excelled and rose to playoff champions.

AICSC goes to High school

For the very first time, AICSC registered a high school boys team to participate in the Greater Akron Amateur Soccer Association (GAASA) competitive games. Our players competed with some of the area's best teams including two of Cuyahoga Valley Christian Academy's (CVCA) teams, and Firestone High School's boys soccer team. The majority of our 19 players had been in our club for at least four years. Their skill level along with the dedication of three outstanding coaches led them to be division champions. 


1ST ANNUAL KAREN MARYTR DAY TOURNAMENT

A SOCCER FAMILY'S STORY

Coach Dele and the Inner City Soccer League have been a tremendous blessing to my family this, our inaugural year with the league. I am Youth Pastor J. Howard Streeter III of Mount Calvary Baptist Church of Akron, OH and a Licensed Professional Counselor.

The effect of GAASA and Inner City Soccer on my family was evident and long lasting. My wife and I have 3 children, Julie, Stephie and Isaiah, and this year all three of them played for Coach Dele's club. Julie and Stephie were on the same team, as Julie was 12 and Stephie is 11. Julie used to be in ballet at the University of Akron for young girls for three years and we decided to discontinue the high-quality program there to pursue other interests for her. Isaiah at 8 years old has been playing soccer for two Akron YMCA programs and the Shaw Jewish Community Center in Akron. Stephie is a swimmer at the University Akron's youth classes for 8 years, but she also wanted to join Isaiah and Julie in soccer.

This year, I remembered the account from a former church member from about 9 or 10 years ago, Farrah Howard, about a phenomenal new soccer league led by African soccer players with vast experience with the sport – much more than Americans. At the time she praised the work of Coach Dele as foundational for her sons. Our son started playing and immediately made friends and developed a camaraderie that was unparalleled for him, as an only son in a family with two older sisters. Julie picked up the sport immediately and became a star player for her team and met some girls that accepted her and welcomed her and Stephie - they even made up nicknames for each other - that really made me feel good about the program. In addition, Stephie's blessing this year was her body becoming toned like never before.

The icing on the cake of this season for our children was that my son's team was the Division Champs and our girl's team made it to the championship game. The morale on each team was extremely high by the end of the season and this year's games and practices were also important to the improved sportsmanship awareness by the players on the teams my children played. Top-notch coaching was a given that pushed the children to meet their potential without exasperating the players.

My wife and I both contributed to the league as my wife volunteered for the Awards Ceremony and I helped negotiate field availability with Coach Dele and the City of Akron. I also benefitted greatly from walking during practices to improve my own physical health. I must also add that the excitement of the games was riveting for our family and guests including our children's grandparents. It was truly a positive experience for the Streeters at Inner-City with Coach Dele, one of the most dedicated people I've ever known in my life. He is definitely a gift to our community.
