### **Notes from Coach Dele**

In 2014, Akron Inner City Soccer Club <u>celebrated our fifteen year anniversary!</u> We give thanks to the God for His abundance of blessings. Our Year Round Youth Development/After School Soccer Program continues to be a trailblazer in bringing an affordable program to the members of our community. Our program provides unprecedented, and unparalleled, opportunity to the at-risk and under-served inner city children of Akron.

As in previous years, we began the year with 6 weeks of indoor footskills training. These sessions help to improve our players' skills and technique in the off-season. We then followed with eleven weeks of spring training and league games. For 2014, we developed 12 teams with a total of 160 boys and girls. In the Summer season AICSC held 4 weeks of free summer soccer camps, at four different locations throughout the city. AICSC'S 2014 summer camp proudly reached over 400 community children. We ended the year with 11 weeks of Fall practices and league games, where we fielded 11 teams, and served 140 boys and girls.



One major highlight of 2014 for myself and the club was to be recognized by the Honor Project for our work in the community. I remain proud of all of our players, parents, and the generous contributions from individuals, foundations, and our dedicated coaches. Our success this past fifteen years is made possible by all of you. I look forward to another successful year where we continue to raise the bar on our skills and activities on and off the field. ### **The Honor Project**

A highlight for the 2014 season came in the awarding of funds from The Honor Project Trust. On September 14, 2014, The Honor Project awarded Akron Inner City Soccer Club with a \$5,000 grant to continue its work in the community.

The brainchild of the Honorary Judge John J. Russo, of the Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court, The Honor Project Identifies and honors 501 (C) organizations throughout the State of Ohio that are working as vehicles for social Change. The Honor Project Trust was created using

the surplus of funds from case settlements with the State of Ohio. In 2014, over six million dollars was distributed to various organizations throughout the state of Ohio. ### **4<sup>th</sup> Annual Akron Unity Tournament**





