NOTES FROM THE PRESIDENT





UNITED WAY OF SUMMIT COUNTY BOLD GOALS INITTIATIVE 2018 - 2025

We are delighted that Akron Inner City Soccer Club continues to participate and work alongside United Way of Summit County Bold Goals Initiative.

Goal 1: 65% of Akron Public Schools third graders reading at or above grade level (currently at 38%)

Goal 2: 90% of Akron Public Schools high schoolers graduating in 4 years, with 60% college/career ready. Currently, at 80% and 19% respectively.

Goal 3: Financially empower 11,000 people. Currently 42,000 people in Akron are considered to be "working poor" with the skills, knowledge and resources to budget and save, manage debt, build credit and access banking services.

Goal 4: Reduce ER visits due to drug overdoses to 1000. Currently at 2,400 annually.



Our program continues to provide the unique opportunities made possible strong connections with the parents and participants who are the target population in the bold goals' initiative. Our program provides after school partner opportunity with the participants and enable us to encourage them to stay in school since studies have shown that staying in school will lead to high graduation rate and help to increase the percentage of the students that will either college or career ready. We track the school attendance of our participants through the Summit Education Initiatives (SEI). We were encouraged when seeing the Risk Level data from the Marking Period 1 (MP 1) and Making Period 2 (MP 2) the High Risk Level among our participants dropped by 6% and Some Risk Level increased by 6%. Those are great signs and indicators that our participants are listening and making good decisions and going to school and that our program is having positive impact.








