NOTES FROM THE PRESIDENT





y sincere thanks to the players, parents, coaches, referees, and our sponsors for your support through a very different soccer season due to the pandemic. Since 1999 when the program was founded, we have never had any interruptions like last year. Three of our teams participated for the first time in the Cleveland Indoor Classic Tournament that was held January 11 & 12, 2020. Teams from as far as Indiana, Chicago, Michigan, and Canada participated. We tied our game against team Tigress from Chicago. With each team scoring three goals, that meant we had to go to a shootout. They won, and we ended up being the runners up. It was a great game and a good experience for our players.

We completed the annual winter training at the end of February of 2020 at The House of the Lord church. The program came to a halt in the second week of March of 2020 when COVID-19 put a stop to everything. Spring sports programs were cancelled. We were given the green light from the City of Akron officials to hold the annual free summer soccer camps in June. We followed the guidelines and the safety protocols for COVID-19 and were able to offer the summer soccer camps with limited participants. The children were extremely happy to be outside for a change. Thanks to our sponsors for providing the financial support for the purchase of the PPE used during camp and distributed to families. 2020 SUMMER CAMP PROGRAM REPORT

Our program has partnered with the Summit Education Initiative for over five years. One of the goals of the partnership is for them to help us collect the critical data that we need that will help us achieve the United Way of Summit and Medina Bold Goals Initiative 2018 - 2025. Our partnership with the Unity Way Bold Goals Initiative is to achieve the goal of 90% of Akron Public Schools high scholars graduating in 4 years with 60% college/career ready. Currently, at 80% and 19% respectively.

Here is part of the report of the 2020 Summer Camp from Summit Education Initiative. I thank you for the great work you the Out of School Time Partners (OSTP).

ABOUT SUMMIT EDUCATION INITIATIVE

Summit Education Initiative (SEI) is a research based nonprofit backbone organization working to support personal and regional prosperity through educational attainment in Summit County, Ohio. SEI does not directly operated programs. SEI has established research partnerships with schools to analyze and report trends in student's success across the region. SEI measures cradle to career educational outcomes across the region, identifying inequities and opportunities for improvement. SEI also works with Out of School Time Partners (OSTPs) that support students beyond the school day while OSTPs work directly with students, SEI coordinates and manages their program evaluations. Same philanthropic organizations in the region financially, SEI does not charge partners for small-scale program evaluations; Thus, costs would change the dispersion of grant funds from one nonprofit to another. Philanthropic organization in the community view their SEI investments and these OSTPs as mutually reinforcing the activity to drive system change.

CONCLUSION SUMMARY OF THE RESULTS IMPROVED ATTENDANCE

The average absences for your summer program (1-6) were lesser than the district absence (2-4) post summer. Students in your program has excellent attendance patterns in school after your summer program. A significant majority (87%) of your students with a history of perfect attendance maintained that level of excellent attendance during the first marking period of the 2020 school year. A third of your students (33%) who has high risk attendance before attending your program started the 2020 school year with excellent attendance. This sustenance and increase in excellent attendance among your perfect attendance and high risk students respectively can increase academic success throughout the year 2020 school year.

SCHOOL BASED ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT GRADE POINT AVERAGE

Academically, your students spring to fall GPA patterns are better than all summer program or the district GPA patterns, as indicated on the previous section of this report. Students who had low achieving high-risk GPA before the program, a third (33%) made considerable gains and started the school year with low-risk high achieving GPA a after your program. Of your students who had high performing GPAs at the end of the 2019 school year, a significant majority (86%) retained their high achieving academic performance at the beginning of the 2020 school year as well. However, the GPAs of 14% of your achieving students declined from spring to fall.


