
### FROM GAASA TO OSTSL

### PARENTS CORNER WITH WILMOT SOWA



My name is Wilmot A. Sowa, originally from Sierra Leone and I've been a parent and coach at Akron Inner City Soccer Club (AICSC) since the Summer of 2016. Coach Dele, the president of the club, opened his doors to me when I was mostly in need of practicum experience towards my bachelor's degree in Exercise Science/Coaching. He made me feel right at home from the very first day I spoke with him. I have no doubt that his great personality, love for the game of soccer and care for the Akron community, led to the twenty plus formidable years of AICSC thriving existence, a home to numerous families and hundreds of kids. With the help of sponsors, partners, parents, coaches like myself, AICSC has provided fundamental soccer skills, academic support, and in general, contributed significantly to the development of many kids that have passed through it. This non-profit organization has undoubtably been an integral part of our community and I am personally grateful. I have grown both as a parent and a coach during my six plus years coaching with the club. The environment is so welcoming such that coaches, who are usually volunteers, get the opportunity to learn from other coaches, parents, and from resources provided by the club. In return, the coaches use these knowledge and skills to basically prepare the youths for this great journey of life, by teaching, coaching, advising, and guiding them every step of the way. Amazingly, as parents/coaches, we sometimes find the experience to be mutual, learning a thing or two ourselves from interacting with these kids. I can never forget the day one of the boys walked up to me after a game we just won and congratulated me on our win but also reminded me that he has been a defender since the league started five weeks ago. The truth is, I became comfortable with the fact that he played defense so well and forgot that I've

promised to have each player learn to play at least two positions. That experience reminded me to be a man of my word, regardless of the circumstances. The very next game, I had him play striker and he was even better. Today, the club has produced a record number of intelligent, hardworking, student-athletes all across our Akron Public Schools (APS) and beyond. I'm proud to say that both of my sons, Dileh (11 years old) and Domah (5 years old) are in the program. Dileh, and many of his U13 teammates, who've been with the club since they were only five years old, are humbly walking this blueprint of success as they (under my coaching and that of my peers) play exceptional soccer, setting a good standard for the much younger ones. Just this 2022/2023 season alone they went undefeated in the Ohio Travel Soccer League (OTSL) hence becoming the champions and at the same time becoming champions at the Mike Good Memorial Tournament (see photos). Their love and energy for the game is precious; thanks to a successful and affordable program like AICSC which make such platform available.

Many parents, coaches, like myself, are very grateful for the presence of AICSC in our community and quite excited about the future. With our new soccer facility set to be completed and available for use this year, we can't wait to see the additional growth it brings to not just the club but the Akron community in general.


