Some of the benefits include better school performance, evidenced by improved attendance and grades as stated by Summit Education Initiative (SEI). Another benefit is better physical and mental health. Many former players are now attending colleges or on a career path. Some have returned to the program as coaches or referees generating a moderate income. We came to Akron Inner City Soccer because they are a strong, competitive club. Ever seen an 8-year-old attempt a goal-scoring bicycle kick? Come to practice and you might. These kids are amazing, and they're genuinely having fun.

The coaches demonstrate a blend of diverse styles and perspectives. But it's the diversity within the team that truly enriches our kids' experiences.
