Akron Inner City Soccer Club: 2025 Year in Review

The Akron Inner City Soccer Club enjoyed another successful year in 2025. This forty-one-week program exceeds my expectations every year. The program provides a comprehensive platform that presents participants with an exceptional opportunity to acquire soccer fundamental and essential life skills. As usual the program commenced with eight weeks of indoor winter foot skills training, offered at

no cost to all eligible youths within the capacity limits of the Elder Johnson Family Life Center at The House of The Lord.

This was followed by three months of outdoor spring practices, league games, and tournaments. Following this, four weeks of complimentary summer camps were provided from Monday to Friday at four city locations, offering local youth valuable opportunities for participation. In addition, the Summer Essential program was introduced, offering three weeks of activities.

This was followed by three and a half months of fall practices, league games, and tournaments. It was a great honor to welcome the Nickelodeon Filming Studio to our city for their Game Changers – Chasing Goals episode, which featured one of our players, and was televised nationally during the month of November of 2025.

I am sincerely grateful for the collaboration and dedication of the community partners, including players, parents, coaches, drivers, sponsors, and supporters. Thank you for making a difference for the youth in our community. Thanks to The Almighty's guidance and blessings.

My Journey with Akron Inner City Soccer Club:
From Player to Coach

Soccer has been a huge part of my life for as long as I can remember. I started playing for Akron Inner City Soccer Club back in 2nd grade and continued through 8th grade. Those early years weren't just about learning the game; they were about building lifelong friendships, learning teamwork, and developing a love for the sport that has stayed with me ever since.

Looking back, I'm so grateful for the experiences I had as a player. Soccer taught me discipline, resilience, and how to work as part of a team. I'll always remember how much fun it was to be on the field with friends, facing challenges together, and pushing myself to be better. The lessons I learned during those years shaped me into who I am today.

Now, after 17 years, I've returned to Akron Winner City Soccer Club—but this time as a coach. I'm lucky enough to be coaching the U10 girls' team, with players ranging from ages 7 to 9. It's incredible to be on the other side of the game, guiding a new generation of athletes. I love coaching these girls. Watching them grow, develop their skills, and build confidence on and

off the field is one of the most rewarding parts of my life now. Every practice, I get to see them take on new challenges and improve in ways they never thought possible. It's a privilege to be part of their journey.

For me, coaching isn't just about teaching them to play soccer; it's about helping them believe in themselves. I want to nurture each player's unique strengths and encourage them to work together as a team. The growth I've seen in them, not just as players but as individuals, is something I'll never take for granted.

When I see these young girls develop confidence, get excited about the game, and start working together as a team, it reminds me of how I felt all those years ago. Soccer has a way of bringing people together, building character, and giving us the tools to face challenges in life.

At the end of the day, I'm just happy to be a part of their growth. Helping them reach their full potential—whether on the field or in life—is the most fulfilling part of coaching. I'm so proud to be able to give back to the sport that gave me so much when I was their age.





Summer Soccer & Leadership Program – July 2025.

In July 2025, Coach Todd designed and led a three-week summer program for 3rd–5th grade students, partnering with an Akron Public Schools teacher to create an experience that blended soccer, critical thinking, and leadership development. The program was made possible through the support of Youth Success Summit (YSS), which secured the funding and selected Akron Inner City Soccer Club to implement and lead the program.

The central focus of the program was one guiding question: Why is soccer the most popular sport in the world, yet less popular than other sports in the United States—and how can we help make soccer more popular in Akron? Students explored this question through age-appropriate discussions about access, culture, media, community identity, and personal experience, then connected those ideas directly to their time on the field.

Soccer sessions were designed to support players of all experience levels, beginning with fundamental skills and progressing toward teamwork, communication, and game

understanding. Emphasis was placed on creativity, inclusion, and joy for the game, while classroom sessions fostered confidence, leadership, and the ability to express ideas and solutions.

By the end of the program, students not only showed growth in soccer skills, but also demonstrated a greater understanding of how sports can bring communities together—and how they themselves can play a role in shaping the future of soccer in Akron
